I remember Dixie had to rescue me from a pair of pants that I could not get back off of my feet. I was literally sitting in the dressing room floor with her tugging my pants off over my feet. Thank God shag pants are usually wide at the ankles.

Now that we are both in the shag club and going on shag trips together, our relationship and the fun has grown. We've been told that you can hear us laughing through the walls of our hotel room. Truthfully, it was probably my laugh, but Dixie made me do it.

The last few years have been better because I've gotten to share the club and dance that I love with my sister whom I love. We've worked together on projects, met new people, and danced until we couldn't half walk back to the condo at SOS.

In my final article as president, I would like to thank my sister for being my best friend, for spending time with me and going on shag trips and for always having my back. It's been a good ride and I'm glad that we got to take it together.

I have always said that the best part of the Richmond Shag Club is the people in the club. I've had the pleasure of working with some wonderful people in the club and I have very much enjoyed serving as president of the club. I'm sure that the 2012 board will do a magnificent job and I look forward to seeing you at the club.


enjoying. Lisa Cox a new and regular shagger makes them for us. They are magnetic, legible and only \$5.00. Stop by and order yours.


